2019-2020 SCHEDULING DETAILS

The Class Registration ICON on Parent Portal will remain open through MARCH 1ST for all students to enter their class requests. ALL STUDENTS MUST HAVE 8 CLASSES AND 2 ALTERNATES.

Beginning March 1st counselors will review course requests for accuracy and graduation progress. If parents and students wish to make changes after MARCH 1st you must contact your school counselor as the screens will be turned off.

CTE PROGRAMS REQUIRE APPLICATIONS

Current 9th and 10th grade students who wish to access the following CTE pathways must also submit an application. These applications are due MARCH 1st.

These pathways are:

Auto Technology: (Electric Systems I & Brakes)

Carpentry: (Principles of Carpentry I & II)

Welding Technology :(Principles of Welding I & II)

Masonry: (Principles of Masonry I & II)

Cosmetology: (Cosmetology I & II)

Academy of Health Profession: (Structures & Functions of Nursing & Foundations for Medicine) 10th grade only

When selecting classes for these programs students must select both classes.

Note: These applications will be reviewed and students not accepted will be placed on a waiting list but will need to have alternate selections. Decisions will be made late March.

Service Learning in QAC is done differently than in the other counties around us.

This is why it is often confusing for parents.

Maryland requires that students earn 75 hours of Service Learning. However, QAC does not count hours.

Instead, we complete projects that are “infused in the curriculum.” Three of these projects are completed
