Selecting Senior Year Classes

Guidelines:

- In most cases minimum graduation requirements are finished...except English IV.
- All seniors must have a math class during the senior year.
- Each student should select courses on What's BEST---NOT what's EASIEST!
- ALL STUDENTS SHOULD HAVE A FULL SCHEDULE!
- **COLLEGE BOUND STUDENTS:**
 - Continue courses that show academic rigor through the senior year!
 - Continue your math sequence!
 - Consider AP classes and/or Dual Enrollment
 - Use caution when selecting Internships.
- **CAREER BOUND STUDENTS:**
 - Finish Tech Prep classes.
 - Consider additional technical classes.
 - Consider Internships within your pathway area.
 - Consider additional math or Adv. Topics Algebra II as a review.

Other Options & Changes.

- **AP Classes.**
- **Waiver of 2nd Semester**
 - If all graduation requirements are completed in 1st semester, (H.S.A. tests and Service Learning) a student may consider entering the work force in January and return for graduation in May.
 - Students and parent **MUST** have a conference with Mrs. Betts between now and July 1st to review the plan. **MUST** be submitted in writing by parent & student to Mrs. Betts. This is forwarded to the Superintendent for Approval.
- **Work-Based Learning**
 - **Internships** -- must have minimum 1.75 GPA and good attendance. Must work a minimum of 7 hours per week per class period. Maximum of 2 classes.
 - Internships should align with your chosen pathway and subject to approval.
- **Dual Enrollment**
 - **Chesapeake College** – Must have 2.5 GPA. Take 2 – 4 classes. GPA below a 3.0 may require a placement test for math or English classes.
